The theme this year is:

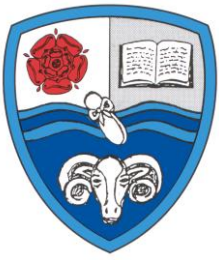
'Growing Together'

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Covid 19 guidance

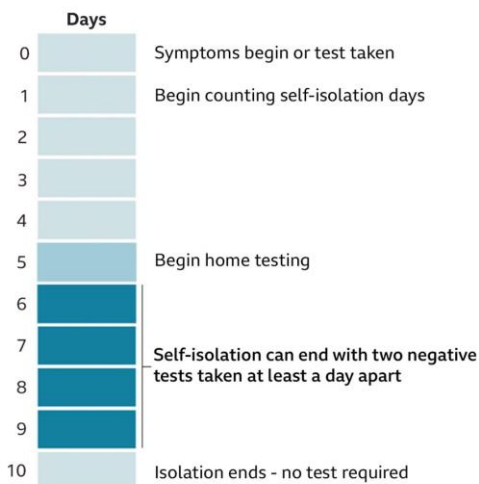
At the current time Covid 19 is highly prevalent both nationally and within the local community. This week school emailed a letter that provides some detailed advice and guidance, please could you ensure you familiarise yourself with this.

Please could we also ask your support in testing your child via LFD's on a regular basis. **If your child tests positive, please do not send them into school and they must self-isolate.**

From Monday 17th January all positive cases must self-isolate for a minimum of 5 days from the date of the positive test and can only end their isolation if they have 2 negative LFD tests; which are taken 24 hours apart on day 5 and day 6. If this occurs then isolation can end from on day 6.

I have included a diagram below to assist you with the current isolation rules.
