
Hello everyone!

We have had a busy week filled with lots of fun and enjoyable learning.

Maths

Our math's learning this week has been finding number bonds for numbers up to 6.

We are building on our part-whole thinking and subitising by partitioning numbers in different ways and representing this with number bond diagrams. This is supporting our understanding of addition and subtraction.



Home learning: The children have loved singing rhymes such as Five Little Speckled Frogs and Five Little ducks (we have been regularly changing the number, e.g. 6 frogs or 4 ducks). You can sing this at home using any objects/fingers and ask the questions how many are here?/in the pool/pond? How many have gone/are on the log?

Key Vocabulary: Part-part whole, altogether, group, set, how many, more, fewer.

Phonics

We have continued with our phase 3 phonics. This week we have learnt two new phonemes (sounds) "th" & "ng".

"th" and "ng" are both **digraph's**, two letters that make one sound.

The children have been recognising and recalling the phase 2 and phase 3 sounds, blending the sounds to read words and we have even been holding sentences in our heads to independently write.

Home learning:

Ask your child what is a digraph? (two letters that make one sound).

When you are reading can your child find the digraphs?


Please read DAILY with your child.

Our core text this week was:


In Every House, on Every Street.
