## Reception Class Weekly Newsletter

### 08.03.2024.

The Reception class has been very busy this week! We received an exciting parcel in the post, celebrated World Book Day with lots of activities and enjoyed lots of outdoor learning in the dry and sunny weather.

## Maths

This week we have been learning about patterns. Before Christmas we focussed on $A B$ patterns (e.g. red, blue, red, blue / circle, triangle, circle triangle). We are now extending the children's previous experience of $A B$ patterns to more complex patterns such as $A A B, A B C$ and $A A B C$ patterns.

The children have been recognising patterns which develops their skills when making connections and predictions. We have explored patterns in a variety of forms using physical objects and more abstract representations, such as sounds and movement.

The children have been creating patterns during both indoor and outdoor play, they even did this at forest school using lots of natural resources. They shared lots of fun and laughter when spotting the mistakes in Miss Smith's patterns.

Home learning: Can your child create complex patterns at home. Please send photos on Class Dojo, the children love to share these with their friends.


## Our core text this week was:

The Naughty Bus.


This week the children each had a ticket to come on Miss Smith's bus. Whilst on the bus, we read our new story.

The children found this story very funny and exciting!

We recalled key events of the story and put them in the correct order of what happened first to last.

## Phonics

We have continued with our phase 3 phonics. This week we have learnt three new phonemes (sounds) "oa" "oo" (long )\& "oo" (short).

Examples of the "oo" (long):

- Spoon, moon, boot, hoot.

Examples of the "oo" (short):

- Book, look, hook, shook.

Our new phonemes this week are all digraph's: two letters that make one sound.

The children have been recognising and recalling the phase 2 and phase 3 sounds, blending the sounds to read words and we have continued to hold sentences in our heads to independently write.

## Next week our core text is:

Rosie's Walk


We will be ordering simple experiences in relation to themselves, and others including stories, events, and experiences.
