

English:

The children are now in the revision period before their KS2 assessments so we will now be revising the key points of the Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling test. We will also go through different reading techniques on how to access the information in a variety of texts and answer the questions as coherently as possible.

Mathematics:

The children will now be revising and revisiting the maths topics we have learnt this year for their end of key stage assessments. We will go through these as a whole class then independently solve Sat based questions on them.

Science: Electricity

Over the half term children will learn how to identify the risks involved with electricity and how to keep themselves safe.

Children will learn how to construct technically accurate circuit diagrams using the standard symbols.

They will also learn how to make a working circuit, and identify and fix faults in a circuit which does not work. The children will also begin to explore the idea of resistance within a circuit.

Music: Ukulele

The children will be taught by a specialised music teacher who will teach them how to play the ukulele and how to read music and rhythm.

Year 6 Summer 2

Computing:

Creating Media – 3D Modelling

Learners will develop their knowledge and understanding of using a computer to produce 3D models. Learners will initially familiarise themselves with working in a 3D space, moving, resizing, and duplicating objects. They will then create hollow objects using placeholders and combine multiple objects to create a model of a desk tidy. Finally, learners will examine the benefits of grouping and ungrouping 3D objects, then go on to plan, develop, and evaluate their own 3D model of a building.

History: World War 2

The children will be investigating and answering the question; How did Hitler try to exert power over Europe? They will learn about the causes and timeline leading up to WW2, how life changed for different people in Britain and the significance of the Blitz. The children will also learn about how the holocaust occurred and what we must do in the future so it never happens again.

RE- Islam

Year 6 Key Question (to be used all year): Is life like a journey? Focus Question (for this investigation): What is Hajj and why is it important to Muslims?

PE:

The children will practise different kinds of striking and fielding activities on a Monday with BFC. The girls will then refine their athletic skills on a Friday with Mrs Thomas and the boys will go swimming with Mrs Ashworth.

We will also be completing the daily mile every day.

French -LE SPORT, QUEL TEMPS FAIT-IL AUJOURD'HUI

The children will talk about what sports they like to play and what they think of different sports. They will give reasons for their different preferences and sporting events.

Art: Year 6 Art and design: Photography

Through developing their photography skills, children cover useful artistic concepts in a new context, looking at: composition, colour, light, abstract images and underlying messages. Familiarising themselves with new photography artists, children gain a new perspective on the way they look at the people and objects around them, capturing and presenting images in different ways.

PSHE – Being the Best I can be.

The children will consider these questions:

- Something you would like to achieve in the next 10 years.
- What might help you to achieve this - things you can do now.
- Any obstacles or blockers that you might need to overcome - and how you will do this.

They will go through the unit where they will look at risk, well-being and how to build resilience.
